Arts and Humanities: 9 units

At least one course from the arts and one course from humanities; topics such as literature, history, philosophy, ethics, visual and fine arts, theatre, and intercultural studies; some are major specific 9

Social and Behavioral Science: 9 units

Must be from at least two different academic disciplines, such as history, sociology, psychology, public policy, and business; some are major specific 9

Physical and Biological Sciences: 7 units

Minimum of two courses and one lab in the biology, chemistry, and science categories; some are major specific 7

***Six (6) units of history is required. They can be used toward either Fine Arts/Humanities or Social and Behavioral Science.*
