## LEADERSHIP IN ACTION

Riki Hawk, a former military non-commissioned officer and contractor who served in Afghanistan for many years, is now using his Jessup education to serve those in need. He spent the last four months advocating for the protection and relief of Afghan individuals that were stranded when the United States pulled out of Afghanistan in August 2021. In response to receiving three to four emails a day requesting help, Riki began writing letters to the Special Immigrant Visas program and to date, he has not only assisted 50 families to escape safely from Afghanistan, but has been able to share biblical resources with many of them.

After graduating with an MBA from Jessup in 2020, Ricki has now joined the Master of Arts in Leadership program with plans to pursue a career in leadership coaching. "Everybody has their own leadership style, but I want mine to be based on Christian values and servant leadership," said Ricki.

He believes there is always more work to be done, but partnering with the Holy Spirit is where true change happens. God has uniquely equipped him to help people, like those in Afghanistan, through a model of servant leadership. He is excited to coach others in his second half of life.

After attending a Preview Day at Jessup, he was excited to learn that the biology department could customize his educational track to achieve his long-held goal to attend pharmacy school.

"The professors knew I was interested in pharmacy, and they helped me seek out those opportunities," said Matthew about his Jessup faculty. "Even though we don't have an official pre-pharmacy concentration here, they worked with me to build that concentration and the connections I needed to succeed." With a personal recommendation from Dean of Natural and Applied Sciences, Dr. George Stubblefield, Matthew already applied his skills through an internship program at California Northstate University researching pancreatic cancer.

Matthew was recently accepted into the College of Pharmacy at the University of Florida, nationally recognized for its advanced pharmacy education programs. "My goal is to use my love of chemistry and my distaste for blood to be able to treat patients and heal people with knowledge," said Matthew.



## DREAMS MADE POSSIBLE

After attending public middle and high school, Taylor MacCuish knew she wanted to attend a Christian university. ## A HEART TO SERVE

For the past nine years, Eddy Sanchez has served youth and young adults through para-church ministries and nonprofit organizations in the Greater Sacramento region. A Jessup alumni and biblical studies graduate, he ministers to the local community through building relationships and showing the love of Christ in day-to-day settings. "We provide services, such as mentoring, facilitate cohorts at school sites and juvenile detention centers, and provide professional development training for teachers and staff," said Eddy.

Many youth have struggled with emotional regulation and stability at home this year, along with depression and stress. Backed by the Christ-centered education and experiences at Jessup, Eddy is uniquely equipped to meet these challenges. "The kingdom of God is all around me," he said. "He has blessed me with opportunities to serve my city and community-to shed light in places that need His light and love."

Eddy's heart for serving others was nourished by faculty and staff during his time at Jessup. His team of supporters included Christy Jewell, Director of Career and Life Planning. "She has coached me and mentored me in various ways through life-on-life discipleship," said Eddy. He still drops by the University to share and celebrate the positive impact he is able to make through an education built on the Word of God.
