Undergraduate Institutional Aid Policy:

- The total of all Institutional Aid awards combined with Cal Grant (excluding the subsistence portion of Cal Grant B) cannot exceed 100% of a student's tuition charges regardless of living situation.
- All Institutional Aid awards are based on one academic year of enrollment at full-time status (at least 12 units per semester). Amounts are split in half each semester, and students enrolled in only one semester will receive 50% of the total amount. Students enrolled less than full-time (but at least 6 units) will have awards prorated accordingly based on the number of units for which they are enrolled in each term.
- Institutional aid is subject to change should a student switch from living on-campus to being a commuter.

Institutional Aid:

1. William Jessup Scholar Award for Freshman

Amount: Full Tuition Scholarship. Replaces all other institutional aid.

Eligibility:The William Jessup Scholar award, named after our founder, is a competitive
award for first-time-freshman students who have achieved academic
excellence and are committed to becoming change agents in the world
through servant leadership, ingenuity, and unwavering faith in Christ.
Applicants must have an academic GPA of 3.80+ and an ACT (Composite) of
29+ or SAT (Critical Reading and Math only) of 1300+.

Applicants must have completed the process of applying for admission and Deadline: submit the <u>WJU Scholar Showcase Application</u> with the essay response by <u>December 1st.</u> Annually renewable if the recipient maintains a WJU GPA of 3.50 or above, maintains full-time status, does not take more than one approved semester leave of absence, and lives on campus for at least the first two years. If WJU Scholar recipient drops below a 3.5 WJU GPA but remains above a 3.0 WJU GPA they will be dropped to a Presidential Scholarship award (based on their Admission's GPA & SAT/ACT scores). If WJU Scholar recipient drops below a 3.0, they will permanently lose their Presidential Scholarship award but they may be able to earn a \$2,000 Academic Scholarship.

2. Academic Scholarships For Freshman And Freshman Transfers

Freshman and Freshman Transfer Academic Scholarships are determined by using high school transcripts submitted through the 7th semester.

Freshman Transfer Students are those students who have attempted less than 30 college semester units prior to transferring to William Jessup University. Students who have completed 30 or more college units prior to graduating high school may still be considered freshmen if they have not completed further units after high school graduation. <u>NOTE:</u> Academic awards are based on transcripts given at the time of Admission. *Academic scholarships, excluding William Jessup Scholar award, are renewable with a cumulative WJU GPA of 3.00.*

These awards will be granted to all eligible transfer students in the traditional undergraduate program with 24 or more academic transferable semester units. Eligibility is determined at the time of acceptance and is annually renewable by maintaining a cumulative WJU GPA of 3.0.

Transfers with less than 24 academic semester college units completed at the time of application, with a minimum college academic GPA of 3.00, will have their scholarship award determined by a combination of their high school (academic GPA) and college records, using the dollar amounts of the transfer awards.

Note* Academic GPA is determined by the Director of Admission at the time of formal acceptance into the traditional undergraduate program at William Jessup University. Eligibility will not be re-evaluated based on subsequent tests or coursework. Eligibility is determined by Academic GPA and number of academic transferable units.

6. Church Partnership Grant

Eligibil ity:	This need-based grant is available to NEW students who, at the time of initial enrollment, are members of/actively participating in a <u>church that</u> financially supports William Jessup University. CURRENT students may also apply IF the student was a member of/actively participating in a partner church at the time of initial enrollment; OR the church becomes a partner while the student is currently enrolled; AND that church continues to be the student's church home. If other scholarships or grants are secured by a student after the awarding of a Church Partnership Grant, <u>the amount may be reduced</u> .
	This grant recognizes both the church's partnership with WJU and the recipient's past contribution to the church. Receiving this grant <u>may not be tied to future participation</u> or involvement at the church.
Deadli ne:	Church Partnership Grant Application must be submitted by May 1. If funds are available, students who miss the Fall deadline may apply for a Spring award by December 1. Funds are limited. Priority given to early applicants.
Renew al:	This grant must be applied for each year with a new application.

7. Community College Grant

Eligibil ity: This grant is offered to NEW traditional program transfer students coming from a community college who have completed at least 24 transferable semester units at the time of acceptance with a minimum 2.0 GPA. If a student is enrolled in classes at a community college upon acceptance into WJU that will bring them above 24 transferrable units, their Community College Grant will be a pending award until the verified completion of those classes.

8. Diversity Grant

Applicants must be an incoming freshman or transfer student, must have a minimum 2.80 academic GPA, and must live on-campus in order to receive this award.

What is the difference between a Subsidized and Unsubsidized loan?

A Subsidized loan is a loan for which the government pays the interest on the loan while the student is in school and during the grace period. An Unsubsidized loan is a loan for which the student is responsible to pay interest that accrues on the loan during and after school. Payments on both loans are deferred until after you have ceased attending school OR drop below half-time.

25. Alternative Or Private Loans

Alternative or Private Student Loans are credit-based loan for students who are enrolled in 6 or more units.

Amoun t: Up to the cost of attendance minus financial aid.

Eligibil ity: Credit-based loan for students who are enrolled in 6 or more units. Borrower must be a US Citizen, eligible non-citizen, or an international student with a U.S. Citizen Cosigner. Both eligible non-citizens and international students need to have a current address in the United States.

Interes t Rate:	Varies according to lender and borrower (and cosigner) credit history.
Repay ment:	Begins 6 months after student graduates, drops below 6 units or withdraws from school.
Renew al:	Not renewable. Must apply yearly.
Applic ation:	We partner with <u>FASTChoice</u> to provide a list of historical lenders, but <u>you are free to choose any private lender.</u> Applications are completed through your lender. Your Financial Aid Counselor will reach out to you if you are approved for a loan in order to confirm with you.
Note:	Alternative or Private Student Loans are designed to supplement federal, state, and institutional financial aid. Borrowers must be credit worthy, many times requiring a co-signer. Eligibility:	Students must be a current or former foster youth under the age of 22 (as of July 1) and have financial need as determined by the FAFSA. For full explanation of eligibility, <u>click here</u> .
Deadline:	Students must submit the FAFSA and Chafee Grant Application by March 2.
Renewal:	Annually renewable.
Application:	FAFSA (online) with WJU listed and <u>Chafee Grant Application (online)</u> .
Note:	Chafee Grant can be used for child care, transportation and living expenses while in school.

27. Federal Work Study

Amount:	Varies
Eligibility:	This program is for the financially eligible students interested in employment (as determined by FAFSA). Students will have the opportunity to work on or off campus and receive wages for those hours. Jobs vary and wage is determined by the department that employs the student.
Deadline:	No deadline.
Renewal:	Not applicable.
Application:	FAFSA (online) with WJU listed.

At WJU, we pride ourselves on reviewing the entirety of your personal financial situation, and then making a final decision. You are NOT simply the result of a formulaic bunch of numbers. You are a unique individual, created by our Lord, and will be treated as such!

Important Considerations: The Net Price Calculator...

IS NOT For Everyone	Currently, the NPC is designed for <u>US Citizens or Permanent</u> <u>Residents who are planning on attending college in a year or two.</u> The calculator may not fully capture your unique situation, so we always recommend contacting the financial aid department for more personalized information.
IS NOT Totally Inclusive of All WJU Aid Programs	There are a few things that just can't be perfectly incorporated on an <u>estimator</u> – most notably our need-based WJU Grant and the CA State Grant. The calculator also cannot account for performance-based scholarships such as Athletics, Music, and Competitive Department Scholarships.
IS Confidential and Anonymous	You may choose to send your results to a personal email if you would like to save the results for later viewing.
IS a "What If" Tool	It is designed for you to run it multiple times to see "what might happen if"
IS NOT Perfectly Accurate	It is only as good as the data you enter. If your data is incorrect, the <u>estimate</u> will also be incorrect – either too high or too low.
IS Educational	You should never rule out a school simply because of 'sticker price', or even by the results of the NPC. Using a school's calculator is another tool to find out more about a school in which you are interested. Please do not stop considering <i>any</i> school because of price! Cost is certainly a factor — but it should <i>never</i> be the only factor.

IS NOT a Guarantee of Financial Aid	This will come from the WJU Financial Aid Office after you apply and are accepted to WJU.
IS NOT an Application of Admission to WJU or a Financial Aid Application	Apply to WJU or <u>Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for</u> Federal Student Aid)
IS NOT an Accurate <i>Payment</i> Estimator	The NPC starts with something called a 'Cost of Attendance' – or COA. This includes the <i>sticker price</i> (typically tuition, room, board and mandatory fees) BUT it also includes <i>standard estimates</i> for other expenses you might incur throughout the year – such as travel, personal items, books, and even living costs (like pizza, movies and laundry!).Rememberthese are just estimates! What you will pay directly to WJU will most likely be substantially less than the COA.
IS NOT Static Information	Your info may change from semester to semester; federal and state laws certainly change on a whim; and WJU aid programs are subject to change/modification from time to time.

Keeping Your Aid

Each scholarship has its own requirements that you must be aware of and complete in order to maintain eligibility. In addition to these requirements, all students must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). Requirements of undergraduate SAP include that you achieve a 2.00 GPA and complete at least 66.67% of your courses.

Renewing Your Aid

Most types of financial aid are renewable yearly, but many require renewed applications or documentation. It is always recommended that you complete a FAFSA as early as possible each year. Unless you plan to waive the FAFSA each year, the Financial Aid Office will not renew your aid until a FAFSA has been completed. Make sure to keep an eye on your student portal document tracking page so that you never miss a deadline.

Finding Additional Aid

There are two major forms of additional aid that students can apply for during their time at Jessup. Loan Consolidation

Student loan borrowers are required by the federal government to complete Exit Counseling within 30 days of graduating, dropping below 6 units or withdrawing from school.
