A HEART FOR CARETAKING

Brittany Sorber came to Jessup to study nursing with three years of experience providing in-home care. While overseeing her grandfather's transportation to and from dialysis daily, she and her husband saw the need for quality caretaking and started their own Non-Emergency Transportation Company (TLC). Together, they took care of her grandfather as he became increasingly ill. Through this experience, Brittany grew to love the medical field, and after two years of prayer and developing hands-on skills, she stepped out in faith to pursue her nursing degree.

"I prayed about which school to choose, not knowing Jessup had a nursing program yet," said Brittany, grateful for how God eventually led her here. "I have had to relearn how to learn after being away from school for 10 years. What a blessing this whole process has been. I can't wait to see all the Lord is going to do."

NURSING PROGRAM LAUNCHES

In Spring 2023, Jessup launches the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program, which takes a holistic approach to healing and healthcare. Students will learn how to promote comfort, healing, and wholeness by aiding patients with the best possible level of care.

With a new state-of-the-art Simulation Nursing Lab, every student gains hands-on practice. In a controlled educational environment, professors can simulate hundreds of real life healthcare scenarios for students to gain practical experience and expertise prior to entering the workforce.

Nursing Program Director, Jen Millar was instrumental in developing curriculum, helping create the simulation lab, and working with the Board of Registered Nursing for the approval of this innovative program. Jen's career has spanned over 30 years with clinical practice in Mother/Baby, Pediatrics, and Labor & Delivery. In the past 11 years, she has been involved in higher education and has a passion for educating future registered nurses.

"This program will equip students for the profession and further an understanding of their calling," Jen states. Her prayer for each student is that they develop a deeper love for Jesus as they care for the most vulnerable people. Jessup nursing students will soon serve the local community, and abroad, as the hands and feet of Jesus.

PAVING THE RUNWAY

This spring, Patrick Marquina became the aviation program's first graduate. Joining Jessup's aviation degree program in its earliest stages allowed Patrick to take ownership over his education in a special way while simultaneously participating in the Air Force ROTC program.

During his time at Jessup, Patrick developed patience, perseverance, and strength that extended beyond his flight simulations into his faith in Christ. "My experience as an aviation major was a challenge because this degree has high standards," said Patrick. What prepared him for success was collaborating closely with peers and professors who became more like friends and mentors. Once he earns his commercial pilot's license, Patrick plans to join the Air Force as a second lieutenant military officer.

Throughout his studies, Patrick received a variety of generous funding: the Auburn Aviation Association Flight Scholarship, Provost Academic Scholarship, Church Partnership Grant, Ed Harris Memorial Scholarship, William Jessup University Grant, and Scholars Grant. "None of this would have been possible if it wasn't for my family, dedicated University staff, scholarship donors, and classmates," said Patrick, grateful for how this aid fueled his dreams and calling.

LOCAL AND GLOBAL IMPACT



CHRIST-CENTERED LEADERSHIP IN BUSINESS

Israel Alvarez, Jr. is a sophomore who believes Christian leadership is just as important in the business world as in the Church. An accounting major and first-generation college student, Israel came to Jessup after being introduced to the Kern Scholar Program by Professor John Gallegos, Director of Casa Latina. With a special focus for those serving in Latino churches, the program empowers students to earn a bachelor's and a master's degree in as little as five years.

"My favorite thing about Jessup is the relationships between students and professors," said Israel.

Outside of class, Israel works as Professor Gallegos's administrative assistant, a role that allows him to see the impact of Christ-centered higher education in both the workplace and the Church. He also shares his story at local Latino churches to let them know about unique opportunities available to prospective Jessup students. These include leadership certificates, the Kern Scholar Program, and scholarships offered to church leaders.

"The financial literacy we see throughout our congregation is minimal," said Israel, who hopes to create a support system that helps first-generation Latino students develop these important skills. "Most parents don't know what FAFSA is. I think that expertise in a field like accounting could be a great step toward settling in the U.S. and helping immigrants like myself and my family."

GLOBAL OUTREACH

In 2022, Jessup faculty, staff, students, and alumni participated in outreach trips to South Asia, East Africa, Central America, and the Middle East. Together, they encouraged believers, worked in a hospice facility, supported vulnerable women, and served in different sites led by local believers, including the areas of sports, microfinance, trade school, women's social work, healthcare, and English tutoring.

Beyond Books

Twelve Jessup students and alumni traveled to Amman, Jordan in June 2022 to volunteer at a library that seeks to support free access to the world of literature for the people of Jordan. This library runs educational day camp programming for families all summer long. STEM, reading, art, and physical activities kept Jessup students busy for two weeks, and each one returned with a love for Middle Eastern culture and the Holy Land.

COMING IN 2023

This summer, Jessup has five global outreach trips planned to the Caribbean, Western Europe, Middle East, East Africa, and Southeast Asia. As of now, we have 58 total participants, including seven staff and faculty.
