FINDING FAITH AT JESSUP Sepideh's Story

Sepideh Sefidari encountered God's love and kindness in a powerful way when she came to Jessup as an international student from Tehran, Iran. Initially planning to attend a master's program in Chicago, the homesick Sefidari scheduled a quick Labor Day weekend trip to see her aunt and grandmother in Northern California. "I'm very emotionally connected to my family," she said. "When I came to visit, I realized I would be more comfortable attending a university closer to them."

Sefidari acted fast, immediately applying to Jessup and within 10 days, she was enrolled in Jessup's MBA program. "My whole experience feels like a miracle," she said. When she came to the United States, she planned to earn her graduate degree to help with the successful architectural business she ran back in Tehran. As she settled into the Jessup community, things began to change. She quickly formed closeknit relationships with classmates who impressed her with their support, helping her find a new, full-time job as a project manager for Jplus Architects, Inc.

Sefidari also benefits from relationships she has formed with faculty, especially Graduate Studies

Director and Assistant Professor for Jessup's School of Business, Ken Raskin. "Professor Raskin was my first professor," she said. "It wasn't just about education, I could tell he really cared about all of his students. He also prayed before classes and that made me curious about Christianity. I wasn't raised in a religious family, but I always had the desire to know the real God."

Last year, Sefidari gave her life to Christ. She continues to deepen her understanding of Christianity by studying the Bible, praying and attending a local Iranian church, allowing her to stay connected to her heritage.

PASTORAL MINISTRY MEETS PROFESSORSHIP

Professor Backfish's Story

Associate Professor for Jessup's School of Theology and Leadership, Dr. Libby Backfish spends a lot of time listening to the needs of the Church. With a foot faithfully planted in academics and another in pastoral ministry, she also serves as Theologian in Residence at Granite Springs Church in Lincoln, California.

Each of these communities, Jessup and Granite Springs, actively support her dual roles, which enriches her contribution in both spaces.

"It's part of Jessup's mission statement to partner with the Church, so it's something we all believe in," Backfish said. "But how do we practice it? This is just one way."

Additionally, her time is spent as a wife, mother, avid hiker, and author of two forthcoming books, including a 400,000 word commentary on the Book of Psalms. Although she doesn't expect to find perfect balance between these commitments, her focus is on stewardship—a thoughtful allocation of the gift of time God has given her.

Backfish's pastoral ministry experience is also a rich blessing for her students, as it helps her develop trust while she gets to know them individually. After learning she is also a pastor, some students often reach out to grab coffee together and wrestle through a specific theological question.

"Nobody falls off my radar," said Backfish, whose favorite class to teach is Biblical Hebrew because of the intimate class size and flexible pace. "I can get students the support they need, if they are willing to take it."

Backfish's life and work is just one expression of the importance of learning in community at Jessup. This year, the School of Theology and Leadership also formed the Center for Church Health (CCH), another way for Jessup's faculty to be a faithful presence in the local community.

TELLING STORIES THAT MOVE PEOPLE *Kyle's Story*

Kyle Barr, a 2016 business marketing alum, owns a successful, full-service production company based out of Sacramento called GRDN Media. Projects have taken him across the world, filming on multiple continents, even going off-grid a few times to capture quality stories. Working on both national campaigns and local commercials for companies like NBC, Puma, Yeti (and his alma mater's 2023 rebranding campaign video), his team creates storydriven videos, social content, and photography.

"We tell stories that move people," the film director and CEO said. "Stories bring us together, teach us new things and show us what it truly means to be human – and we want to do that for every business we work with."

In today's market, just in the Sacramento region alone, the GRDN Media team stretches clients' budgets 10 times what other companies can, simply by expanding their creative potential. "No matter the budget, we always push the limits to tell a captivating story that moves our clients' audience," Barr said. Also a member of the men's soccer team while at Jessup, Barr has fond memories of his well-rounded undergraduate experience. His coursework provided a strong foundation to the business arena and filmmaking in a variety of capacities. For example, his robust liberal arts education provided a key opportunity to take directing classes with Jessup Theatre faculty where he learned the nuances of storytelling. The experience uniquely equipped him for the creative and technical work he does everyday within his career.

"My Jessup education provided a genuine foundation to grow upon," said Barr. He also gained direct marketing experience as a student assistant, learning under Jessup staff members who oversaw videography. This type of mentorship and on-the-job training helped catapult Barr to where he is today.

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
