

Provisional Admission and Rescission

All offers of admission to Jessup are provisional until verification of successful completion of all official admissions requirements. Students must submit an official transcript after high school graduation to certify satisfactory completion of all required coursework. Official high school transcripts must be received prior to the deadline set by Jessup.

Jessup may rescind any offer of admission, cancel financial aid awards, withdraw housing contracts and cancel registration at any time before the start of the student's first registered class at Jessup, by making written notice to the student and refunding the student's enrollment deposit and related fees. .

Rescission of admission may be based on the following:

- Jessup determines that the student is ineligible for admission based on a review of the student's final transcript and/or test scores.
- Jessup determines that the student has made misrepresentations during any part of the application or admissions process.
- Jessup determines that the student has engaged in conduct (on or off campus that is inconsistent with Jessup's Community Covenant and/or any other Jessup University policy.
- Jessup determines that a student admitted to a graduate program will be unable to satisfy the academic course and/or program expectations, cohort or practicum participation, and/or licensure requirements which govern the program to which the student seeks admittance.

The determination to rescind admission will be made by a committee comprised of the Vice President for Student Success, the Vice President of Enrollment, and the Registrar. Written notice, including an explanation of the grounds for rescission, will be made to the student whose admission is rescinded. A written appeal may be submitted to the Vice President of Academic Affairs (VPAA) within ten (10) business days of the transmission of a notice of rescission.

The grounds for appeal shall be limited to the following: 1) The determination to rescind admission was based on an incomplete or incorrect academic record that has since been completed or corrected; 2) The determination to rescind admission was based on an incorrect factual finding; 3)) The determination to rescind admission was made by one or more individuals who had a conflict of interest or bias that affected the outcome of the determination.

The VPAA shall provide timely written notice to the student of the outcome of the appeal. The decision of the VPAA shall be final. No additional appeals will be permitted.
