Tuition Costs:

- **Undergraduate On-campus Tuition:**
 - 12-18 units (full-time status): \$18,000 for full-time status per semester. Over 18 units, the cost will be \$18,000 plus \$910/unit for the additional units.
 - Under 12 units (part-time status): \$1,520/unit
- **Undergraduate Online Tuition:**
 - \$550/unit for synchronous programs (live, remote classes)
 - \$500/unit for asynchronous programs (online/at your own pace)

Institutional Aid:

Institutional aid is available for fall and spring semesters only.

William Jessup Scholar Award for Freshman

William Jessup Scholar Award for Freshman	
<i>Amount:</i>	Full Tuition Scholarship. Replaces all other institutional aid.
<i>Eligibility:</i>	The William Jessup Scholar award, named after our founder, is a competitive award for first-time-freshman students who have achieved academic excellence and are committed to becoming change agents in the world through servant leadership, ingenuity, and unwavering faith in Christ. Applicants must have an academic GPA of 3.80+.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Applicants must have completed the process of applying for admission and submit the Jessup Scholars Event Application with the essay response by <i>December 1st</i> .
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable if the recipient maintains a Jessup GPA of 3.50 or above, maintains full-time status, does not take more than one approved semester leave of absence, and lives on campus for at least the first two years. If the Scholar recipient drops below a 3.5 Jessup GPA but remains above a 3.0 Jessup GPA they will be dropped to a Presidential Scholarship award (based on their Admission's GPA). If Jessup Scholar recipient drops below a 3.0, they will permanently lose their Presidential Scholarship award but they may be able to earn a \$2,000 Academic Scholarship.
<i>Application:</i>	William Jessup Scholar Award Application

Academic Scholarships for Freshman & Freshman Transfers

Freshman and Freshman Transfer Academic Scholarships are determined by using high school transcripts submitted through the 7th semester.

Freshman Transfer Students are those students who have attempted less than 30 college semester units prior to transferring to Jessup University. Students who have completed 30 or more college units prior to graduating high school may still be considered freshmen if they have not completed further units after high school graduation.

NOTE: Academic awards are based on transcripts given at the time of Admission.

Academic scholarships, excluding William Jessup Scholar award, are renewable with a cumulative Jessup GPA of 2.00. The awards below are for incoming students starting Fall 2025.

These awards will be granted to all eligible transfer students in the traditional undergraduate program with 24 or more academic transferable semester units admitted for the Fall 2025. Eligibility is determined at the time of acceptance and is annually renewable by maintaining a cumulative Jessup GPA of 2.0.

Transfers with less than 30 academic semester college units completed at the time of application, with a minimum college academic GPA of 3.00, will have their scholarship award determined by a combination of their high school (academic GPA) and college records, using the dollar amounts of the transfer awards.

Note* Academic GPA is determined by the Director of Admission at the time of formal acceptance into the traditional undergraduate program at Jessup University. Eligibility will not be re-evaluated based on subsequent tests or coursework. Eligibility is determined by Academic GPA and number of academic transferable units.

Athletic Scholarships

Athletic Scholarship	
Amount:	Varies
Eligibility:	Traditional undergraduate students competing in intercollegiate athletics may be eligible to receive an Athletic Scholarship. Men's sports include: baseball, basketball, cross-country, golf, soccer and track. Women's sports include: basketball, cross-country, soccer, softball, track and volleyball. Athletic scholarships may stack with academic and Scholar Showcase awards only.
Deadline:	Determined by Athletic Department.
Renewal:	Determined by Athletic Department.

Christian High School Graduate Scholarship

Christian High School Graduate Scholarship	
<i>Amount:</i>	\$2,000 per year
<i>Eligibility:</i>	First-time freshman. Student must graduate from an ACSI accredited high school. Final official high school transcripts with graduation date will serve as final verification.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Eligibility determined at time of acceptance.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable. Student must maintain satisfactory academic progress.
<i>Application:</i>	No application required.

Church Partnership Grant

Church Partnership Grant	
<i>Amount:</i>	For Traditional Students: \$2,000 per year (1/2 disbursed each semester). For Online & Graduate Students: 10% discount of tuition charged
<i>Eligibility:</i>	This need-based grant is available to NEW students who, at the time of initial enrollment, are members of/actively participating in a church that financially supports Jessup University . CURRENT students may also apply IF the student was a member of/actively participating in a partner church at the time of initial enrollment; OR the church becomes a partner while the student is currently enrolled; AND that church continues to be the student's church home. If other scholarships or grants are secured by a student after the awarding of a Church Partnership Grant, the amount may be reduced. This grant recognizes both the church's partnership with Jessup and the recipient's past contribution to the church. Receiving this grant may not be tied to future participation or involvement at the church.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Church Partnership Grant Application must be submitted by May 1. If funds are available, students who miss the Fall deadline may apply for a Spring award by December 1. Funds are limited. Priority given to early applicants.
<i>Renewal:</i>	This grant must be applied for each year with a new application.
<i>Application:</i>	Church Partnership Grant Application – to be filled out by a pastor (at the supporting church) who knows the applicant well. Renewal Application

Community College Grant

Community College Grant	
<i>Amount:</i>	\$2, 500 per year
<i>Eligibility:</i>	This grant is offered to NEW traditional program transfer students coming from a community college who have completed at least 24 transferable semester units at the time of acceptance with a minimum 2.0 GPA. If a student is enrolled in classes at a community college upon acceptance into Jessup that will bring them above 24 transferrable units, their Community College Grant will be a pending award until the verified completion of those classes.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Eligibility determined at time of acceptance.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable. Student must maintain satisfactory academic progress .
<i>Application:</i>	No application required.

Diversity Grant

Diversity Grant	
<i>Amount:</i>	\$2,000 per year
<i>Eligibility:</i>	This grant is for NEW Traditional Undergraduate students only. This grant is competitive and based on financial need, academic achievement, and demonstrated leadership and vision through multiculturalism. Applicants must be an incoming freshman or transfer student, must have a minimum 2.80 academic GPA, and must live on-campus in order to receive this award.
<i>Deadline:</i>	The Diversity Grant Application is due TWO weeks from the time of acceptance. Notifications will be sent out on a rolling basis.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable by maintaining a cumulative Jessup GPA of 2.00 or above. Students must be active with multicultural educational activities on campus and must continue living in the on-campus housing.
<i>Application:</i>	Diversity Grant Application and FAFSA .

Donor Designated Scholarships

Donor Designated Scholarships	
<i>Amount:</i>	Varies
<i>Eligibility:</i>	Incoming, current, and returning Jessup students, excluding international students, are eligible to apply for privately funded scholarships designated by the donor.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Application opens up during spring semester each year and are dispersed in the following academic year.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Non-renewable. Must apply every year to be reconsidered.
<i>Application:</i>	Endowed Scholarship Application – Currently Closed!

Dr. Parnell Lovelace Multicultural Scholarship

Dr. Parnell Lovelace Multicultural Scholarship	
<i>Amount:</i>	\$20,000 over 4 years \$5,000 per academic year
<i>Eligibility:</i>	Incoming full-time, first-time freshman Jessup students are eligible to apply. Students must demonstrate: GPA Requirement: minimum 3.00 and maintained annually. Leadership in fostering communities that celebrate multicultural engagement and diversity. A commitment to fostering unity within the community. Financial need. Alignment with Christian values. Participation Requirement: Active engagement with Jessup's BSU, DRU, Casa Latina, or other multicultural organizations.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Application opens up during spring semester each year and are dispersed in the following academic year (in the fall).
<i>Application:</i>	Submission of a letter of recommendation.

Homeschool Scholarship

Homeschool Scholarship	
<i>Amount:</i>	\$2,000 per year
<i>Eligibility:</i>	First-time freshmen. Student must complete all four years of high school through a traditional homeschool program/network; Does not include charter school/hybrid online/Independent Study Program (ISP). Final official high school transcripts with graduation date will serve as final verification and a letter from homeschool program teacher/administrator demonstrating homeschool eligibility.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Eligibility determined at time of acceptance.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable. Student must maintain satisfactory academic progress.
<i>Application:</i>	No application required.

Legacy Scholarship

Legacy Scholarship	
<i>Amount:</i>	Up to \$2,000 per year
<i>Eligibility:</i>	This scholarship exists to honor the legacy left behind by our Jessup University Alumni. The Legacy Scholarship is available to any sibling or direct descendant (parent, grandparent, great grandparent) of a Jessup University Alum.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Eligibility determined at time of acceptance.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Qualifying students must maintain satisfactory academic progress .
<i>Application:</i>	The Legacy Scholarship Application

Ministry Worker Grant

Ministry Worker Grant	
<i>Amount:</i>	\$2,500/per year for full-time Undergrad students. For PT staff: 20% tuition discount for Graduate and Online programs For FT staff: 40% tuition discount for Graduate and Online programs
<i>Eligibility:</i>	This grant is available to traditional undergraduate program students who are involved in full-time, paid ministry, or who are the unmarried dependent of someone who is involved in full-time, paid ministry. Examples of full-time, paid ministry include: employees of a church, missionary organization, Christian school, para-church or other non-profit organization that focuses on spreading the gospel of Christ. See the Ministry Worker Grant Application below for more information.
<i>Deadline:</i>	To be eligible for award, you must submit your application within your first year at Jessup.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable with a Jessup GPA of 2.0 or above and upon proof of continued full-time employment in paid ministry.
<i>Application:</i>	Ministry Worker Grant Application and FAFSA Renewal Application

Out-of-State Grant

Out-of-State Grant	
<i>Amount:</i>	\$3,000
<i>Eligibility:</i>	First-time freshmen entering the Traditional Undergraduate Program who are not California Residents AND who graduated from a High School outside the state of California. Must be a US Citizen or an eligible non-citizen.
<i>Deadline:</i>	No deadline. Eligibility determined at time of initial Financial Aid package.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable. Student must maintain satisfactory academic progress (as defined by the Jessup Catalog).
<i>Application:</i>	No application required.

Performing Arts Scholarships

Musical Performance Scholarship	
<i>Amount:</i>	Varies
<i>Eligibility:</i>	Traditional Undergraduate Program students who excel in musical talent and ability may audition with the Music Department Chair for this grant.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Determined by Music Department.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Determined by Music Department.

Visual Arts Scholarship	
<i>Amount:</i>	Varies
<i>Eligibility:</i>	Traditional Undergraduate Program students who excel in Visual Arts (visual arts or arts management) may audition with the Visual Arts Department Chair for this grant.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Determined by Visual Arts Department.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Determined by Visual Arts Department.

Theatre Arts Scholarship	
<i>Amount:</i>	Varies
<i>Eligibility:</i>	Traditional Undergraduate Program students who excel in Theatre Arts may audition with the Theatre Arts Department Chair for this grant.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Determined by Theatre Arts Department.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Determined by Theatre Arts Department.

Pastors-in-Training (PIT)

Pastors-in-Training Scholarship	
<i>Amount:</i>	\$3,000-\$15,000/year The amounts of PIT Scholarship will vary, depending on a) the endowment resources available each year, b) the number of applicants, and c) the applicant's financial need.
<i>Eligibility:</i>	Recipients are required to a) serve with the Church Relations Office at Jessup as part of a student PIT team for the year. This will involve up to one Sunday or weeknight travel per month (four assignments per semester) to experience different church settings and styles, and gain experience in speaking and leadership opportunities. And b) participate fully in the Jessup Preaching Club each semester it is offered until they are considered "competent" by the facilitator. Graduate students who receive an award will be required to maintain full-time academic status. Graduate scholarship recipients may be asked to help create appropriate promotional materials from time to time.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Applications can be submitted year-round and will be applied to Fall semester financial aid. A Scholarship Committee will meet at the end of February, April, June, September, and November each year to review any applications, and awards will be determined promptly.
<i>Application:</i>	PIT Application . This is an annual scholarship. Recipients will need to apply each year.

Program Scholar Award

Program Scholar Award	
<i>Amount:</i>	\$5,000
<i>Eligibility:</i>	Each academic program at Jessup University offers a program-specific scholar award. These awards honor students who strive for academic excellence, are pursuing their purpose with passion, and seeking to be a light in the world. Applicants must have an academic GPA of 3.00+ <i>and</i> an ACT (Composite) of 21+ <i>or</i> SAT (Critical Reading and Math <i>only</i>) of 1060+.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Applicants must have completed the process of applying for admission and submit the Jessup Scholars Event Application with the essay response. For deadline dates, please visit Program Scholar Award .
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable if the recipient maintains a Jessup GPA of 3.00 or above.
<i>Application:</i>	Program Scholar Award Application

WJU Grant

William Jessup University Grant

<i>Amount:</i>	Up to \$18,000 per year
<i>Eligibility:</i>	This need-based grant is determined at the discretion of the Director of Financial Aid after all other scholarships and grants are considered (prior to loans). This grant is used to assist in meeting financial need as determined by the FAFSA. If other scholarships or grants are secured by a student after the awarding of a WJU Grant, the amount of this grant will be reduced.
<i>Deadline:</i>	No deadline.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Student must maintain satisfactory academic progress . The amount of this grant is subject to change each year based on changes to your family's financial situation as determined by the FAFSA.
<i>Application:</i>	No application allowed.

Rooted in the Region

<i>Amount:</i>	\$2,000 per year
<i>Eligibility:</i>	First-time freshmen entering the Traditional Undergraduate Program who live within 50 miles of campus as demonstrated by home address on high school transcript.
<i>Deadline:</i>	Eligibility determined at time of acceptance.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable. Student must maintain satisfactory academic progress.
<i>Application:</i>	No application required.

<i>Amount:</i>	Up to \$7,395 per year.
<i>Eligibility:</i>	Eligibility for this grant is based on your enrollment status and your financial need as determined by the FAFSA.
<i>Deadline:</i>	No deadline.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Annually renewable. The amount of this grant is subject to change each year based on changes to the grant and/or your family's financial situation as determined by the FAFSA.
<i>Application:</i>	FAFSA (online) with Jessup listed.

Deadline:	Students must submit the FAFSA and GPA Verification Form by March 2 in order to be considered for Cal Grant for the following school year.
Renewal:	Annually renewable up to four years.
Application:	FAFSA (online) with Jessup listed and GPA Verification Form .
Note:	First-year stipend of \$1,672 can be used for living expenses and books. For the remaining three years, \$9,084 will be applied to tuition and \$1,672 can be used for living expenses and books.

<i>Application:</i>	Complete your FAFSA online to apply for Federal Aid and complete both the Master Promissory Note (MPN) and Entrance Counseling in order to view loan eligibility.

Direct Parent Plus Loan (PPL)

The Direct Parent PLUS Loan is a parent loan for undergraduate students who are enrolled at least half time.	
<i>Amount:</i>	Up to the cost of attendance minus financial aid. Visit studentaid.gov for current information and to apply.
<i>Renewal:</i>	Not renewable. Must apply yearly.
<i>Application:</i>	Complete the PPL application and complete both the Master Promissory Note (MPN) and Entrance Counseling in order to view loan eligibility. After these three steps, please fill out Jessup's Direct Parent Plus Loan request form.

Alternative or Private Loans

Alternative or Private Student Loans are credit-based loan for students who are enrolled at least half time.

<i>Renewal:</i>	Not renewable. Must apply yearly.
